The Curator's Highlight of the Special Display

Unraveling the Fascination of "Kataezome"

Designated as a Living National Treasure for his works of *Kataezome* (stencil picture dyeing), Inagaki Toshijiro (1902-1963) produced numerous innovative and elaborately designed works within the constraints of using the traditional production technique. *Katazome* (stencil dyeing) is one of the traditional dyeing techniques in Japan which uses stencil forming sheet to cut out designs, and after dye-resist wax or rice paste is applied through those cut outs, the remaining areas are dyed. However, Inagaki's stencil dyeing works which employs the same method, contained more of a picturesque quality, and were called "stencil picture dyeing" which recognized him as the first generation who created new designs of stencil dyeing by adopting representational motifs.

Foremost, Inagaki emphasized on sketching natural sceneries. When sketching, Inagaki described it as "drawing the shadow of the object, rather than drawing the object itself," which means that at this point, he was already visualizing the simplified and flattened form. Moreover, living in the southwest part of Kyoto called Katsura, where great numbers of bamboo groves can be seen, Inagaki frequently used ordinary sceneries as a motif, producing various designs of bamboo groves such as Kimono with Bamboo Grove Design. There are other masterpieces such as Fresh Greenery at Higashiyama, which is a series of depicted sceneries of Kyoto, The Tale of Heike, which made his favorite book of old Japanese tale into art, and the Tiger series, being born in the year

of the Tiger (Chinese zodiac).

Also, speaking on innovation of technique, it is the utilization of the technique called *tsuri*, which are the bridges that connect different design patterns, or bridges that connect framework and design pattern. In stencil picture dyeing, fine design patterns are cut out which could cause the stencil forming sheet to disassemble into pieces. Therefore, in order to avoid such cases, the role of *tsuri* joints becomes necessary. However, no matter how complex the design patterns are, Inagaki created the "bridgeless" cutting style by connecting each design patterns together.


Moreover, Inagaki stated "all that is neat, lacks appeal." As stated, Inagaki for example, employs scrapes and blurs of dyes into his works, which would normally be considered a failure in the process of dyeing. This "playful mind" of Inagaki cherishing randomness, is an important part for creating innovative works.


